Bishop Brendan's Letter: A few weeks ago, the Bishops of Ireland were in Rome for the *Ad Limina* visit. This occurs every 5 years or so. It's an occasion to go and pray at the tombs of the apostles Peter and Paul, meet with the various departments of the Vatican and, most especially, spend time with the Pope. Pope Francis greeted us most warmly and we spent about two hours with him. In the course of conversation, a number of topics came up.

The Pope spoke about the World Meeting of Families that Ireland is hosting next year, August 2018. This major world event takes place every few years. The last one was in Philadelphia with around a million people in attendance. Pope Francis commented: "I personally choose Ireland as next year's venue". He spoke of how Ireland has sent missionaries all over the world. He wants us now to focus with a new missionary key on the theme of family. Of course, we hope the Pope himself will attend next year's event.

In the meantime, we need to prepare for it. I would like to invite a few representatives from each parish to a short meeting on Saturday, April 8th in the South Court Hotel, Limerick, to explain the World Meeting of Families. I would also encourage everyone to look at the short DVD on the World Meeting of Families that is available on the Diocesan website.

During our conversation with the Pope, he also spoke about young people. He knows it is not always easy for them in today's society. He has arranged for a worldwide synod next year in Rome on the topic "Youth, faith and vocational discernment". Pope Francis has also sent out a questionnaire as he would like to hear our views on this topic. I am arranging for that questionnaire to be distributed and I ask all interested to send me on their views.

The themes of family and young people were among the six major topics we addressed at our Diocesan Synod last April. I am happy to be able to report that we have set up a Diocesan Family Forum and are now arranging for training in youth leadership.

Another area that came up at the Limerick Synod was that of lay-led public prayer. Recently many attended the short course on lay-led liturgy offered by Diocese. I would now like to let you know that on Tuesday, April 25th each church will have lay-led liturgy prayers. The priests will be away on an in-service course that day.

It would be important for each parish to organise a lay-led liturgy/public prayer on that Tuesday, April 25th as it is part of our preparation for the future. That means, even where there are retired priests who might not be attending the in-service gathering for priests, the liturgy that day in the parish church should be a lay-led public prayer. I would like to ask as many as possible to take part in your local parish prayer.

By way of conclusion, I would like to remind you that next weekend, there's a special national collection throughout Ireland for the *World Meeting of Families*. I ask you to be as generous as possible.

I wish you well for the remainder of Lent, the season of our reconciliation with God and with one another. Thank you for your own commitment in faith. Let's remember one another in prayer.
