

Letter from Bishop Leahy for all Masses - Safeguarding Sunday. 28th May 2017

Since becoming Bishop four year ago, I have made safeguarding a priority. I have met with survivors of abuse and I have found it always very moving to meet with them. On the 3rd of March this year, following Pope Francis' call, I arranged for the Diocese to mark the National Day of Prayer for Victims of Abuse and prayers were held at all masses throughout the Diocese of Limerick on that date. As you know I have also asked that one Sunday be set aside each year as Safeguarding Sunday as a way of keeping the issue of safeguarding to the forefront of all our minds.

The abuse of children and vulnerable persons is a great evil, and despite what can appear to be a saturation of media coverage, it is difficult for us to really appreciate the pervasiveness and profound distress which abuse causes.

Irish society owes an enormous debt to the men and women who have overcome the historical shame barrier and given public testimony to their experience. We must acknowledge also the very significant role the media has played in engaging with people who have experienced abuse and giving them a voice.

Despite the Church's failures in this area, I sometimes think that the very experience of failure to prevent and respond vigorously to abuse by some Church personnel can now, paradoxically, become a contribution which the Church can make to society. What I mean is that yes, we have failed but we must not let ourselves be blocked in our failure but rather realise that our response to this failure can become a valuable contribution of insight and practice that we can now offer to society. Our challenge is to reflect on what we can learn from our failures and to ensure that society as a whole can be helped in overcoming the scourge of abuse of minors.

The Diocese of Limerick is currently reviewing how it ensures children's welfare is promoted in all church activities and how it can work collaboratively with families and communities to promote the welfare of children. In particular, it wishes to support people who may have experienced abuse in their lives and to work with and support agencies who work with those who have experienced abuse.


I welcome all feedback on our present arrangements and encourage anyone with a concern or a suggestion to contact our Safeguarding Service at the Diocesan Office

## Report from Pastoral Council meeting 9th May 2017.

- 1. The meeting was addressed by the two Parish Safeguarding Representatives. The Diocesan Safeguarding Rules will be updated weekend 27th May 2017. Names and numbers of the Parish Representatives are available in the sacristy.
- 2. The meeting was addressed by Angus Mitchell of Limerick Against Pollution (L.A.P.). The Papal Encyclical Laudate Si reminds us of our duty of care to the environment; a parishioner suggested that the Pastoral Council should engage with the issue regarding the Irish Cement Factory. In the light of same Mr. Mitchell of L.A.P. was invited to address the Committee. A similar invitation will now be issued to Irish Cement. We would encourage everyone to actively engage and inform themselves on any issue regarding our environment. as Pope Francis refers to it as "Our Common Home".
- 3. Lay led liturgy on the 25th of April 2017 widespread disappointment amongst congregation that the Eucharist was not distributed at the morning Liturgy. This concern will be brought back to the Bishop for clarification.
- **4.** There is an Ecumenical Service proposed to take place in Crecora in Sept.
- 5. The Committee welcomed Margaret Aherne to the Pastoral Council
- 6. The Report from St. Nessan's Area Pastoral Council meeting held on Mon 8th May 2017 was discussed. A twelve week Youth Ministry programme will be rolled out between September Christmas 2017. Volunteers are sought.
