Why are 78% of our population belonging to the Church but not really connecting?

Bishop Brendan reflecting on this at the Mass of Chrism 2017 said:

We have wonderful news to offer, the very promise of God himself that we heard in today's readings: liberty, freedom, comfort, gladness. We have the wonderful example of people working in or on behalf of the Church; lay people giving up their time voluntary in so many instances, giving true testimony to the word of God by helping others less fortunate. So, why are 78% of our population belonging to the Church but not really connecting? Belonging but not always attending and hearing the powerful message of hope and love that is communicated each week in our liturgy?

I know many would answer that the reasons why people don't come to church are obvious: historical and horrific scandals of abuse, priests living double lives, an overly authoritative institution, a church that wants to dominate all the public space, a church that seems to exclude so many...

I wonder, however, do we need to dig deeper as a society and ask if the phenomenon of people not coming to church with the regularity and fidelity of previous generations, is part of a deeper cultural crisis we are working through.

Christian faith is so deeply rooted in Ireland that it's no surprise that as time advances, with the Church chartering new waters of thought, ways of communicating and social mores, our collective faith experience is undergoing a profound conversion. We are being called to move from a particular form of Church life to a new discovery of the Church as community.

In previous generations, the Church often anchored the sense of community in an area. In our time, we have to rediscover our contribution as Church to society precisely as community. For that to happen, we also need to recognise while there is a sense of community to be found in our rituals or novenas, the deepest experience of God comes in the very person of Jesus Christ who has promised he will be found when two or more gather in his name, that is, in the genuine community-building power of love for one another.

In many ways, however, what marks our particular experience of Church in Ireland is that at the very time we need to move into this new experience of God, we have been damaged by the unveiling of sinister elements of our past and the revealing of wounds still very much present.
