

Fourth Sunday of Easter 22nd April, 2018

Re: W.M.O.F. August 2018.

Dear All,

I attended the information and volunteer meeting on the 18th of April at 10.30 am in the Redemptorists. Emer is the Diocesan delegate (for all enquiries). The Pope will be attending the Saturday and Sunday events (August 25th and 26th) both are free ticketed events. In other words, you have to register in order to attend.

W.M.O.F. Conference : it opens Tuesday the 21st and there will be opening ceremonies in each cathedral/diocese with a street party in St. John's Square and Mass that Tuesday evening in the Cathedral.

The Congress: It runs in the R.D.S. for the 22^{nd} , 23^{rd} and 24^{th} with Mass each evening. It will run from 7 am to 7 pm daily. There is a fee attached to this i.e approximately \in 38 for one day and approximately \in 70 to register for three days). The advantage is that if you register either for one day or the three days then you are then more or less guaranteed a ticket for the Saturday and Sunday events. Only adults pay for the R.D.S. under 18's go free. There are 14,000 registered to date for the Congress.

<u>Saturday the 25th is the Festival of Families</u>. This is a concert style event in Croke Park which will start between approximately 5pm and 7pm. There will be about 70,000 tickets available for this event. It will run for approximately two to three hours (e.g. e.g. at the Philadelphia W.M.O.F. Aretha Franklin and Andrea Bocelli sang).

Sunday the 26th is the Final Mass in the Phoenix Park, again time to be arranged, but Mass time will more than likely be 2 pm (with gates opening and volunteers on site from 4 am onwards). You cannot register for the Saturday or the Sunday events as of yet, because for logistical reasons i.e. traffic plans etc have to be put in place with the Gardai and Dublin City Council etc. There will be approximately half a million tickets available for the Sunday Mass in the Phoenix Park. There will be a lot of walking involved in the Sunday event and people are going to be corralled into different areas and zones depending on what part of the country they are coming from (e.g. the N.7 could be colour coded in red and accordingly people from that side, will be going into the Red Zone). Buses will more than likely be parked a few miles from the Park, so a lot of walking involved.

For people who don't want to do a lot of walking or standing the Saturday evening concert style event may be more suitable however, one would have to register within a day or two of those tickets becoming available in order to secure one. It should be much easier to register for the Phoenix Park with approximately half a million tickets being made available

I have signed up for a newsletter so that should alert us as to when the free registration for the Saturday and Sunday events become available online.

Finally "A Joy for All the Earth" is the official hymn launched for the W.M.O.F. 2018 and should be sung in parishes.
